Testing Technology for Audio-Transcribed Psychological Reports

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Cited and acknowledged in G. William Domhoff, Ph.D.'s Oxford book, *The Emergence of Dreaming* (2017), his "Promising Agenda" chapter confirms the need for "platforms that provide simultaneous audio and voice-to-text recordings that can be sent to a research site for editing and storage in a large database." This workshop presentation tests the method of an app's audio, transcription, analytics, commenting, and export features in solving report quality problems in dreams and cures to disabilities (blindness, deafness, mutism, paralysis, developmental disabilities, Alzheimer's, etc.).

SEQUENCE

Testing the method of an app's audio and transcription in efficiency for study participants and experts, analytics as reporting motivation, comments as a communication tool, and export feature in scaling impact.
