

Aegyptiaca. Journal of the History of Reception of Ancient Egypt **Call for Papers**

Dear friends and colleagues,

“Aegyptiaca. Journal of the History of Reception of Ancient Egypt” is an international open access journal, set up by the Department of Egyptology, University of Heidelberg and published by the University Library Heidelberg as part of “Propylaeum - Specialized Information Service Classics”.

This is the first journal dedicated to the documentation and research of the history of reception of ancient Egypt. It comes out biannually in English language and accepts German and French articles as well. I would like to encourage everyone to write in English in order to have as broad an audience as possible. The quality is ensured by a peer review evaluation process and an advisory board consisting of international well-reputed authorities.

Aegyptiaca tries to encourage a coherent discussion of the concept of Egypt in the West. As this topic is an object of research in many different disciplines the journal covers a whole range of fields and all periods of the history of reception of ancient Egypt and it is open to different approaches and methods. The journal publishes articles focussing on special aspects of the history of reception of ancient Egypt in the different testimonia (may it be texts, art or objects) and intends to understand the detailed aspects as part of a bigger story at the same time.

All submissions must be spell-checked, copy-edited and proof-read. Submitted texts must be consistent in terms of capitalisation, spelling, punctuation, abbreviations, references, headings etc. as detailed in the “guide for authors” that you find on the Homepage of *Aegyptiaca*.
