# THE J. PAUL GETTY POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIPS IN THE HISTORY OF ART AND THE HUMANITIES 1989

#### Objectives and Eligibility:

The J. Paul Getty Postdoctoral Fellowships are designed to advance the understanding of art and its history by supporting the work of outstanding young scholars in the field. To be considered, a candidate must demonstrate a distinguished record of past achievement and a work plan for the fellowship period that offers the promise of a substantial and original contribution to the history of the visual arts.

The 1989 fellowships are reserved for those who have received their Ph. D. degree or equivalent qualification between January 1, 1983 and January 1, 1989. The Grant Program seeks applications especially from scholars proposing to explore connections among the humanistic disciplines. Foreign candidates are encouraged to apply. Candidates in related fields of the humanities are also eligible if their work will contribute to the history of art.

Although in previous years some of the postdoctoral fellowships have been awarded through designated institutions, this year all fellowships (to a maximum of 15) will be awarded through an open competition administered by the Grant Program. The awards are completely portable; fellows may pursue their research wherever appropriate with or without an institutional affiliation. Applicants who choose to affiliate with a university or independent research center are responsible for making their own arrangements with the host institution. Discussions with the prospective host should be initiated before the fellowship application is submitted.

The 1989 fellowship period begins in June 1989. Awards provide a \$23,000 stipend for the fellow for 12 months. They may also provide a maximum subvention of \$3,000 for medical benefits, and library and photocopying privileges at a host institution.

Applicants affiliated with institutions outside the United States who are unable to arrange a full year of leave may apply for a six-month period of support with funds apportioned accordingly. Getty fellows may not accept other awards which provide duplicate benefits, nor may they undertake any form of employment during the period of the fellowship. These awards are not renewable, and they may not be deferred.

# Application Procedures:

The deadline for receipt of completed applications and supporting documents in the office of the Getty Grant Program is December 10, 1988. Supporting documents will include three letters of recommendation, an essay describing the plan of study for the fellowship period. The essay should not exceed 1500 words.

Selection is based on a review of each candidate's past performance; an assessment of his or her potential for developing into an outstanding scholar, teacher, curator, or critic; and the quality of the research plan. Art historians and scholars in related fields review the applications; a fellowship committee makes the final selections. Fellowship winners will be notified in March 1989.

#### NATIONAL GALLERY OF ART CENTER FOR ADVANCED STUDY IN THE VISUAL ARTS Senior Fellowship Program Academic Year 1989—1990

The Center for Advanced Study in the Visual Arts, a part of the National Gallery of Art, founded in 1979 to facilitate study of the history, theory, and criticism of art, architecture, and urbanism, announces its program for Paul Mellon, Ailsa Mellon Bruce, and Samuel H. Kress Senior Fellows. The notable resources represented by the collections of the Gallery, the Library, and the Photographic Archives will be available to Senior Fellows as will the Library of Congress and other specialized research libraries and collections in Washington. Lectures, colloquia, and informal discussions will complement the fellowship program.

*Fields of study:* Applications will be considered from scholars for study in the history, theory, and criticism of the visual arts (painting, sculpture, architecture, landscape architecture, urbanism, graphics, film, photography, decorative arts, industrial design, etc.) of any geographical area and of any period. Applications are also solicited from

scholars in other disciplines whose work examines physical objects or has implication for the analysis and criticism of physical form. In addition, applications are solicited from scholars who are specifically interested in curatorial research related to objects in the painting, sculpture, graphics, and other collections of the Gallery.

Qualifications and selection: Senior Fellowships are limited to those who have held the Ph. D. for five years or more or who possess a record of professional accomplishment at the time of application. Senior Fellowships are awarded without regard to the age or nationality of the applicant. Senior Fellows will be chosen by a Selection Committee composed of scholars in the history of art. Outside readers may assist in the evaluation of proposals.

Senior Fellowships and Visiting Senior Fellowships: One Paul Mellon Senior Fellowship and a total of four to six Ailsa Mellon Bruce and Samuel H. Kress Senior Fellowships will normally be awarded for an academic year, early fall to late spring. Applications for a single academic term of a quarter are also possible. The Samuel H. Kress Senior Fellowships are intended primarily to support research related to objects in the collection of the Gallery. There are, in addition, a number of short-term (maximum sixty days) Ailsa Mellon Bruce Visiting Senior Fellowships. Qualifications for Visiting Senior Fellows are the same as for Senior Fellows. Senior and Visiting Senior Fellowships may not be postponed or renewed. Scholars are expected to reside in Washington throughout their fellowship period and participate in the activities of the Center. All grants are based on individual need. A Senior Fellowship award will normally be limited to one-half of the applicant's annual salary on the expectation that applicants will bring sabbatical stipends or research grants from their home institutions. Senior Fellows receive a monthly stipend and additional allowances for research materials, round-trip travel, and housing. Visiting Senior Fellows receive a stipend that includes travel, research, and local expenses. Senior and Visiting Senior Fellows are provided with a study and subsidized luncheon privileges.

Associate appointments: The Center will consider appointment of Associates who have obtained awards from other granting institutions and would like to be affiliated with the Center. Appointments to Associate status will be considered for periods from one month to an academic year. Qualifications for Associate status are the same as for Senior Fellows. Study space is provided. An Associate may not have teaching or other professional obligations while in residence at the Center.

*Applications:* Separate application forms are required for Senior Fellowships, Visiting Senior Fellowships, and Associate appointments. The application deadlines and award periods are as follows:
