Dr. JOSEPH COHEN is Lecturer of Philosophy at University College Dublin (Ireland) and Guest Professor of Philosophy at the *Staatliche Hochschule für Gestaltung* – Karlsruhe. He has authored *Le spectre juif de Hegel* (Paris, Galilée, 2005), *Le sacrifice de Hegel* (Paris, Galilée, 2007) and *Alternances de la métaphysique. Essais sur E. Levinas* (Paris, Galilée, 2009) and co-authored, with D. Moran, *The Husserl Dictionary* (London, Continuum, 2012). In collaboration with R. Zagury-Orly, at *La Règle du Jeu*, he co-edited *Heidegger et « les juifs »* (Paris, Grasset, 2015) as well as *Heidegger. Qu'appelle-t-on le lieu?* (Paris, Gallimard, 2008), *Derrida. L'événement déconstruction* (Paris, Gallimard, 2012) and *Judéités – questions pour Jacques Derrida* (Paris, Galilée, 2003). In collaboration with G. Bensussan, he also co-edited *Heidegger – le danger et la promesse* (Paris, Kimé, 2006). He is, since 2008, member of the Editorial Board for the Journal *Cités* (Paris, PUF). In 2015, he co-founded the *Rencontres Philosophiques de Monaco*.

His domains of philosophical research span from German idealism to French contemporary philosophy. He is currently writing on the question of *sacrifice* in the history of philosophy and theology.

Dr. RAPHAEL ZAGURY-ORLY is currently Researcher at the Asia and Europe in a Global Context Institute at the Universität Heidelberg (Germany). He is also, since 2004, Lecturer at the Bezalel Academy of Fine Arts and Design (Jerusalem), where, from 2010 to 2014, he directed the MFA program. He has held a Visiting professorship at the Staatliche Hochschule für Gestaltung - Karlsruhe in 2014-2015 and at the Università degli studi di Roma - Sapienza in 2015-2016. He has authored Questionner encore (Galilée, 2010) and, in collaboration with Joseph Cohen, co-edited Judéités - questions pour Jacques Derrida (Galilée, 2003) as well as Heidegger. Qu'appelle-t-on le lieu? (Les Temps Modernes, 2008), Derrida. L'événement déconstruction (Les Temps Modernes, 2012) and Heidegger et "les juifs" La Règle du Jeu, 2015). In 2015, he co-founded the Rencontres Philosophiques de Monaco. He is a permanent member of the Editorial Committee of the journal Cités (Paris, PUF) since 2011 and also Scientific Editor at the Resling Publishing House in Tel-Aviv since 2004, where he has directed numerous Hebrew translations of Derrida, Deleuze, Bataille. His philosophical research focuses primarily on German Idealism and European contemporary philosophy, from Phenomenology to Hermeneutics and Deconstruction. His recent research on European nihilism and its various manifestations in modernity has brought him to focus his work on the philosophical and theological questions of "revelation", "apocalypse" and "election".
